
Greetings from our President.....





FAREWELL, NOT GOODBYE, TO GENE HARRIS!


It's sad to wave farewell to friends, in this case to Gene and Katie Harris, who finally acted upon their long contemplated move to Kansas, bringing them closer to family.

Thanksgiving paddles are a longstanding SNCKC tradition, one put at risk in this current covid climate. Interest remained, however, and the wide launch and lunch spots at Natomas provide for appropriate social distancing. The selected mid-November date featured beautiful weather, hardly guaranteed at that time of year, and the unusual high water level provided an unexpected option not usually accessible to paddlers. We started the day with exploration of a paddling maze located across from the Nimbus Flat launch, and then continued up to out typical lunch stop at Negro Bar.

Negro Bar was closed off, as part of a massive reconstruction project, but the beach remained open. No potluck this time, but we spread out along the beach, ate well, and soaked up the sunshine. Nearby thickets provided for other midpaddle needs.
