



Lake Wildwood Summer Solstice / Full Moon Paddle June 21st, 2024

We all met up at Vista Park Around 6:30. Peter provided maps with potential routes and gave us the rules of the lake at LWW. We launched around 7:00pm. Our goal was to tour part of the lake and end up near Vista Park around 9:00-9:15 to catch the moon rising over the south hills and then takeout and load up. We began to paddle towards the south inlet to the lake, trying to keep in the shade and out of the sun. Found the end of the inlet, turned around and paddled north-west to Pine İsland.


We cruised leisurely along the north shore to the point where the "Gangster" house sat. When we got there, we just hung out and enjoyed watching a bald eagle fishing. It got its claw in the water at one point but came up empty. During this time the flashing blue light at the marina came on, signaling that all lake sunset rules were in now in effect and thus, we had to turn on our lights to make ourselves more visible to other boats and to avoid a citation from the lake patrol.

It was close to 8:45 when we paddled our way back to Vista Park. Hung out just offshore for a bit waiting for the moon to rise but then decided to take-out and load up.

The moon finally peaked over the hills just as we were driving out of the Parking lot.

Because of the hills there is a delay between the fore-casted moonrise and the actual moonrise by as much 30 to 40 minutes depending on location and relative po-sition to the hill tops. The best time to organize a Moonlight paddle is about 2 to 3 days prior the actual full moon.


