The Hudson Bay Girls: Kayaking 1,900km Through the Heart of Canada

An all-female team known as the "Hudson Bay Girls" is more than a month into a self-supported 1,900km kayaking expedition from Grand Portage on Lake Superior to York Factory on Hudson Bay.

Their route follows traditional waterways first traveled by the Anishinaabe people, and later used by French fur traders in the 18th and 19th centuries to connect remote trading posts across the Canadian wilderness.

The journey, expected to take 85 days, began at the end of May with a challenging 13km portage, known locally as "Grand Portage." From there, the team paddled 400km through the pristine Boundary Waters wilderness area, which is threatened by proposed mining projects.

Building on experience

The team has plenty of paddling and wilderness experience, having collectively paddled over 6,400km. The foursome of Olivia Bledsoe, Emma Brackett, Abby Cichocki, and Helena

Karlstrom has varied backgrounds, including roles as wilderness canoe guides, wilderness medical technicians, and trail maintenance foremen in the Boundary Waters and Quetico Provincial Park.

Whether you're a seasoned paddler or just curious, this will be a fun and memorable night. **Don't miss it.**








Golden mussels have been confirmed in over 50 locations across California

Lakes Basin Paddle - June 23rd thru June 27th, 2025

Late June 2025 21 SNCKC adventurers made their way to the Lakes Basin Recreational Area located between the road stop know as Bassets on Hwy 49 and the town of Graeagle on Hwy 89. The campground that most of us stayed at was the spectacular Upper Jamison Creek Campground in Plumas Eureka California State Park Which is located west of Graeagle and just north of the Lakes Basin Recreational Area.

Lake Davis, which gets very few weekday visitors and is known as a trophy fish destination, is a large high Sierra alpine lake with many small islands and deep inlets providing miles

of shoreline to explore. The lake is also prone to high afternoon winds, so our expectations were mixed as we left the campground Tuesday morning. The put-in was about a one hour drive from the campground and the water was nearly dead still (glass) when we arrived there about 9:30am



Put-in was about 10:30 at the Lightening Tree boat ramp on the east shore near the north end of the lake. We paddled up to top of the lake and around the north side of a long island that protected us from any wind. After a little looking around, we found a known channel cut through the island and crossed over to the south side of the island. We paddled eastward along the island shore as the wind began to pick up and found a nice beach for

After lunch, we informally broke up into two groups, one following the east shore of the lake southward back to the boat ramp and the other group adventured out to a long string of outer islands, also paddling south. By this time the threatening winds had died off and we one again paddling in very calm water for the remainder of the trip

The two groups reached the boat ramp roughly about the same time and it was about 3:00 when we hit the road back to the campground with a stop for ice cream at a local burger joint in Graeagle.

To my knowledge, this is the first club expedition to Lake Davis organized by SNCKC.










UTICA RESERVOIR PADDLE-IN CAMPING TRIP—7/7/25 thru 7/9/25




The day was enjoyed by both the long-time members and newer members to hone their skills in a relaxed and fun atmosphere, sharing stories and paddling tips.

The Route Ahead

Recently, the expedition passed through Voyageurs National Park. They stopped to resupply at the city of International Falls, Minnesota, which straddles the U.S and Canada border. The next leg of their journey involves paddling north across Lake of the Woods, a vast body of water notable for its thousands of islands and indigenous heritage.

Following Lake of the Woods, the team will navigate the 240km Winnipeg River. From there, they'll paddle along the eastern shores of Lake Winnipeg for three to four weeks, likely contending with shallow waters and large swells.



The expedition's final stretch is the 480km Hayes River, a Canadian Heritage River historically used by the Hudson Bay Company as a key trading route. The river transitions dramatically from



boreal forest to sub-arctic tundra and is home to several Cree communities.

All being well, the Hudson Bay Girls' journey will culminate at York Factory -- a historically significant trading post pivotal to Canada's fur trade era -- in Hudson Bay.




