## KAYAK NEWS

### Baja Program Teaches Local Kids How to Kayak

**A** weeklong program in Baja gives 24 schoolchildren from low-resource homes in Loreto the chance to learn, grow, and fall in love with the ocean through sea kayaking — all at no cost to their families.

Founded and led by Sea Kayak Baja Mexico's Ginni Callahan, one of the world's foremost kayak coaches and guides who has been providing kayak trips in Baja for over twenty-five years, the program targets local kids, aged 10–15, carefully selected in partnership with dedicated local teachers.

Each year, Sea Kayak Baja Mexico hosts its popular Summer Course (Curso de Verano), a weeklong summer youth program giving local kids a chance to get out on the water and experience the joy of kayaking. Many have never even swum before, but over one action-packed week they learn to paddle, float, wear lifejackets, and see underwater with a mask and snorkel. During the program they also shed fear, gain confidence, and discover how deeply we are all connected to nature. All 24 schoolchildren are from low-resource homes and are given 100% sponsorship. SKBM partners with EcoAlianza and teachers to select deserving kids aged 10-15.

The Nevada County PBA serves to build a community of engaged, "good fire" practitioners by:

- Working with the NCRCD or solely to provide training and technical assistance to landowners in how to burn safely, legally, responsibly, and ecologically beneficial ways.
- Supporting private landowners interested in using beneficial prescribed fire as a tool to improve fire safety, improve forest health, and enhance native plants and habitat.
- Connecting landowners in neighborhoods and Firewise communities to work together to put good fire on the ground.
- Coordinating with the NCRCD to pursue grant-funded opportunities in the future based on community interests and needs, such as more advanced training for prospective burn bosses and others.

This last summer, 12 secondary students from a lower-resource Loreto school district went kayaking, spotting birds, practicing water safety, and learning why the sea matters—many for the very first time. The next week, the program included a younger group of primary school children. A portion of Sea Kayak Baja's outfitting fees on its regular trips support the program.

While Curso de Verano is run by coaches who have earned international certifications and/or are in development, older teens help out as well, giving it a peer component. EcoAlianza's Esquadrón de la Naturaleza "Nature Squad" includes 16-17 year-olds who've demonstrated their commitment to conservation and community, with SKBM's staff training four of them to assist with the program, a valuable leadership experience.

Throughout the program, the children learn and practice such life skills as teamwork, self-esteem, responsible habits, deepening friendships, and cultivating a passionate curiosity for life. They also learn such practical skills as adjusting and wearing a life jacket, floating, swimming, using a mask and snorkel, paddling a kayak and paddleboard, practicing personal safety on the water, and assisting others in need. They also gain an environmental connection to the sea, learning to respect it. The beloved grand finale is always a motorboat trip to Isla Coronados with mask, snorkel, kayaks and picnic lunch on the final day of the course.

### Real Life Success

Don't think the program and what it preaches is transformative for these youth? Consider the following testimonials:

- Maria played on the shores of Laguna San Ignacio as a child. A training program opened doors for her career as a kayak guide, SCUBA instructor, and business partner in EdMar SCUBA school in La Paz.

- Ramon learned to paddle through a school internship program and built his career around it. He guides, coaches, and repairs kayaks in Loreto, where he teaches the next generation at Curso de Verano.

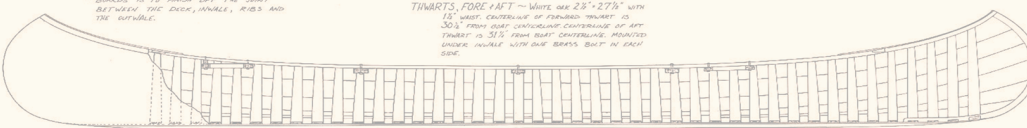

COVER BOARDS - Spruce 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" x 30" shipped as in the plan view, attached with small nails. THE ONLY FUNCTION OF THE COVER BOARD IS TO FINISH OFF THE JOINT BETWEEN THE DECK, GUNWALE, RIBS AND THE OUTWALE.

THwarts, FORE- & AFT - White oak 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" with 1/2" WEST CENTERLINE OF FOREWATER THwart IS 30 1/2" FROM OUTLINE CENTERLINE OF AFT THwart IS 31 1/2" FROM BOAT CENTERLINE. MOUNTED UNDER INWALE WITH ONE BRASS BUSH IN EACH SIDE.

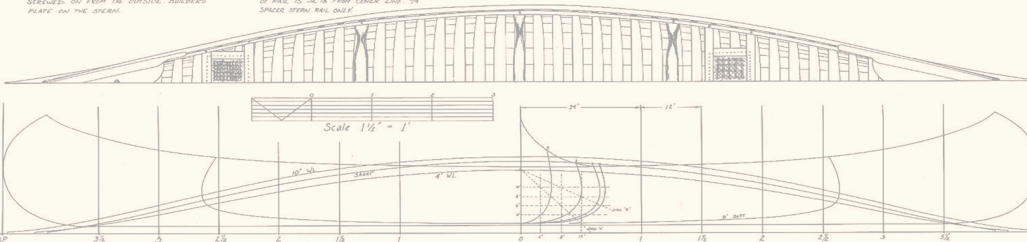


DECKS - Spruce, APPROX 1 1/2" x 7" ONE SOLID PIECE, CLASSIC HEART SHAPE CARVED TO THE CURVE OF THE SHEER AND 3/4" THICK. AN OUTSIDE PATCH IS 2" DEEP AND THE LAMES ARE THINNED IN THE UNDERSIDE. SPLICED ON FROM THE OUTSIDE. GUNWALE PLANE ON THE STERN.

STEM BAND - Birch 3/4" x 1/2" ONE APPROX 31" LONG. SPACED ABOUT EVERY 6".



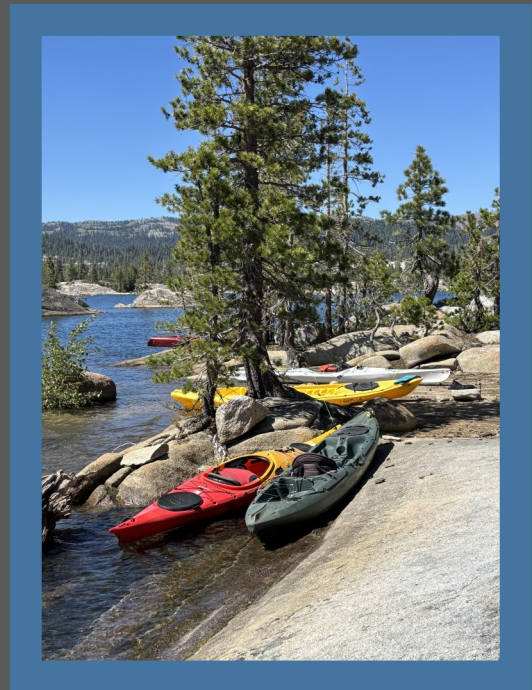
